
An abundance of Roman and medieval monuments, including 29 classified as historical monuments that punctuated the history of the city's ancient and medieval days, promises a change of scenery and cultural enrichment to all of its visitors.

The Tourist Office presents Fréjus, a destination of port of call located in the heart of Côte d'Azur.

The ideal starting point for visiting the major tourist sites of Provence and French Riviera.

Fréjus is also a nice typical Provençal village aged of 2000 years with roman and medieval monuments for sightseeing.

at the heart of **French Riviera**



Forum Julii is the name that the Romans gave to the city of Fréjus, founded some 2,000 years ago by Julius Caesar, when they made it into one of the largest military ports on the Mediterranean. Even bigger than the one in Massilia (Marseille), and also more active, livelier and prouder than its neighbors, the port would forever mark the history of Fréjus.

Forum Julii was one of the Roman fleet's largest naval bases between the Augustan Age and the end of the 2nd century AD, created to protect the coastline from the Gauls.

Forum Julii and the sea, the roman spirit

The port's development really took off after the Battle of Actium in 31 BC, at which Octavian emerged victorious, when all or part of Cleopatra's and Antony's military fleet was transferred to Fréjus.

Despite the weather and its

ravages, and despite its silting and abandonment, the ancient port remained on people's minds, as if it were only awaiting the time when it would return their shared destiny – the sea – to the city and its inhabitants.

Fréjus was nicknamed "the Provençal Pompeii" for its outstanding ancient heritage by historian Camille Julian, born in Marseille in 1859 and author of a monumental work on the history of Gaul, published between 1907 and 1928, in the first scientific work on the subject.

Nowadays, Forum Julii is the best-preserved and best-known Roman port, with its remains including a wharf, fish tank, baths, maritime prefecture and the monumental finery of the Lantern of Augustus. Fréjus is a town whose past began more than 2,000 years back, forming a rich heritage that has left its mark on the area. Since the 9th century, travellers have been admiring the monumental grandeur of the first Roman and then episcopal town, visible in its scenery. Victor Hugo glorified its romantic ruins in his travel diaries, and Prosper Mérimée added the amphitheatre ruins to his first list of Historic Monuments in 1840, in recognition of this extraordinary legacy.


The archaeological digs conducted in the area over the past two centuries are also proof of the town's importance to researchers. Nowadays, Fréjus has its own team of archaeologists and certified archaeological specialists, who tirelessly monitor its urban transformation and carry out preventive digs to uncover the town of yesteryear. One of the most noteworthy recent discoveries was a series of amazingly well-preserved Roman fishponds that were found on Rue Aristide Briand in 2009. After the dig, a process of protection and promotion was undertaken to make the fishponds visible to the public today, as part of an underground archaeological complex. All this archaeological activity makes Fréjus, formerly known as Forum Julii, one of the most studied and best known towns of Roman Gaul, and the one whose Roman legacy is the most visible. Some of its monuments are truly unique, serving as points of reference for researchers, like on the Roman platform and Saint-Antoine Hill, as well as the fantastically well-preserved port.

A town is a thing in perpetual motion. And Fréjus, which is neither frozen in its past nor indifferent to its future, has made the choice to promote its history through town planning that is always changing and evolving. For example, that's how the Roman Platform Park and the promenade along Saint-Antoine Hill came into being. More projects are on the horizon, like enhancements to the visitor experience at the Roman port, which serves as the link between the old town centre and the new Port Fréjus.

Port Fréjus, yesterday, today and tomorrow

PORT-FRÉJUS, full blown place of life

Today, Port-Fréjus is one of the main marinas of the Mediterranean coastline, with an area of 7.2 hectares, 900 boat rings up to 40 meters... and its sweetness of life. It is also a real full blown neighborhood, with its housing, shops, restaurants and entertainment during the summer.

Since its creation, Port-Fréjus has been strongly committed to protecting the environment. Some 50 fish nurseries are located under the docks, and its policy for the preservation of marine biodiversity has payed, pays and continues to pay off:

And **tomorrow**?

In the continuity of the construction of the Promenade des Bains connecting Saint-Raphaël to Fréjus, Port-Fréjus will transform itself in the next ten years in order to adapt to the image of its customers and the evolution of the destination.

The customer service will be privileged as well as the economic development linked to the sea, thanks to the optimized management of the infrastructures. Natural areas will continue to be protected as water and electricity counters will be upgraded. For communication, interactive totems will soon be installed around the port to limit the use of paper.

Finally, Port-Fréjus will create a boat washing centre with recycled water to save this precious resource that freshwater became.

Work will begin this year.

Glenn FAUCHON Director réjus wouldn't be what it is and wouldn't exist at all without its port !

Originally built by the Roman Legion under Caesar and Augustus to serve as a naval military and merchant base, its founding purpose was to make Forum Julii (now Fréjus) a port town oriented towards the Mediterranean.

Although the fleet of Augustus, who defeated Cleopatra and Marc Antony, never made its way to the Gulf of Fréjus, its port still holds secrets and distinctive features unlike anywhere else in the world !

Port Fréjus is one of the main marinas on the Mediterranean coastline. Spanning 72,000 m² with 900 mooring rings and a legendary laid-back lifestyle, thousands of boats dock here each year, including yachts more than 40 metres in length.

The port is Blue Flag and Clean Port certified, and it even won an award for nautical environmental innovation in 2019 and 2022.

Going forward, and in line with the brand-new Promenade des Bains, Port Fréjus will be permanently transformed over the next 10 years ! The port will adapt to reflect its clientele and the evolution of Fréjus as a destination.

Rediscovered marine tradition

François Léotard, Fréjus city mayor, opens Port-Fréjus on the 12th July 1989. Thanks to its creation, the town gets its naval vocation back, which is the reason why it did so well through the Roman time.

In creating Port-Fréjus, the local council wants also to convert and make the coastline more beautiful : tourists loves Fréjus-Plage, looking for a family and peaceful seaside resort.

The Port-Fréjus marina brings the sea and the town centre together, thanks to a urban link marked out by cultural and leisure activities, by shops and restaurants.

The marina construction permitted to quickly reach these goals, and to give it its own identity.

Yesterday roman harbour

Two thousands years ago, the Roman people called Fréjus « Forum Julii ». It is one of the most important Mediterranean harbours : bigger, more animated, more full of life than Marseille (Massilia). Fréjus fights the devastating time effects : during the Middle Ages, Fréjus picks up again after getting stuck in the sand and keeps prospering thanks to the trade.

The ancient harbour kept the ruins of its hours of glory : they are still proudly up in the town.

Today european marina

For more than ten years, a team of passionated men and women are working relentlessly to build Port-Fréjus. The inauguration rewards them for their efforts, and the results are stunning : a 7,2 hectares surface area, a opening 65 meters large, a breakwater 220 meters long...

Today, Port-Fréjus has 849 mooring rings for ships of 40 meters maximum : it is still one of the principal marinas on the Mediterranean coastline.

Even the marina conception makes it different of the others : Port-Frejus is not only a beautiful marina, but a real neighbourhood thanks to its three thousands houses, shops and its own events.

Port Fréjus II the canal

In order to build this extension, the town of Fréjus worked with experts (jurists, technicians, chartered accountants, urban planners and architects). The neighbourhood is organized around a navigable channel, dug in the bell tower of the town centre axis. Modern buildings are running alongside the quays, which are set up for pedestrians. The promenade is quiet, far from the principal marina excitement.

The project in figures : 33 000 m² of habitations and 7000 m² of public equipment.

FRÉJUS FISHING BOATS, to immerse you in the traditions of Provençal fisherfolk.

These pointus – small boats that are typical of the ports of Provence – can be found along the coast of the French Riviera. Although mainly used as fishing boats, they can also serve as passenger boats or pleasure boats, whilst maintaining a certain romantic, nostalgic je ne sais quoi.

Don't hesitate to admire them, take pictures of them and chat with their owners, who always have plenty of anecdotes and one-of-a-kind knowledge to share.

Important: A pointu isn't a pleasure boat that you can hire, as witnessed by the Provençal proverb, "Si me coneïsse pas, me toques pas!" ("If you don't know me, don't touch me! "). These hard-tomanoeuvre boats are original watercraft that remain true to the fishing skippers or amateur sailors who own them...

When you wander through my streets and alleys, you have entered one of the oldest towns in all of France! I know what you're thinking: I don't look my age! But the men who built me, the Romans, died long ago, and I'm still here!

Over the seasons, the years and the generations, the people of Fréjus have formed strong bonds with me and the more than 2,000 years of heritage that I contain, an immense source of pride that they are always happy to share.

My Roman domūs (villas) and my shopping thoroughfares where people once communicated in Latin eventually gave way to ramparts and armoured men ready to do anything to defend my churches and chapels. Then, after those troubled times, Napoleon appeared on my shores as yet untouched by contemporary tourism.

Finally, at the dawn of the modern age, I became a garrison town that was open to the world, which pointed me straight towards the town I am today, in a wonderful mix of ancient heritage and vibrant daily life.

In addition to my 30 historic monuments, I am also home to extraordinary natural heritage: calanques, fine sandy beaches, the Ponds of Villepey, umbrella pine forests, the Base Nature leisure facility and nature area, and the Estérel Mountains are all preserved spaces that make me a wellspring of joy and love, and a great place to live. In other words, I provide an idyllic setting between sea and mountains, where the sun shines down more than 300 days a year!

So, let your inspiration guide you, and who knows? Perhaps a love story is in the cards for you and me, one with a heart of pure azure...

Because the monuments of Fréjus aren't only there to be admired. They need to be examined, explained and narrated.


Which is why I have designed these itineraries for you, so Fréjus doesn't become just another destination that you visit without really understanding it.




Notre-Dame-de-Jérusalem Chapel : Jean Cocteau's legacy in Fréjus.

In 1962, Jean Cocteau gave in to the requests from Fréjus : he would create decorations for its new chapel.

His spirits, his friendships and his loves are on display in this beautiful chapel, a gem hidden among the pines, a sort of last will and testament recorded in the stone of this sacred place. Drawings, sketches, stained glass windows and mosaics, the great Cocteau used all of his talents to design this shrine, tinged with symbolism, that our guide will help you decipher.







Malpasset dam : the story of a catastrophe.

Malpasset was aptly named (in French, it sounds like "goes badly"): it has left a permanent mark on the history of our town and our country, owing to its violence and the devastation caused by the catastrophe.

On 2 December 1959, the Malpasset Dam gave way in the middle of the night.

The immense wave that crashed into Fréjus, carrying away 423 of our citizens, was the chaos that preceded the unprecedented reconstruction of our town, where not only the stones had to be rebuilt, but also the people's souls.

Since 1959, life there has recovered, but nothing is quite like it was.

These days, the site is a place of remembrance forever scarred where the dam's ruins still lie in the valley.



The Ponds of Villepey, an unspoilt garden of Eden within reach of town

Between a fine sandy beach and the Argens River, the Ponds of Villepey are a unique, unspoilt oasis within easy reach of town!

A preferred safe haven for more than 220 species of animals, with an immense variety of plantlife, the Ponds of Villepey are amongst the rare coastal wetlands on the French Riviera and are of particular interest for their flora, their fauna and their scenery that enchants visitors all year long.

The 2.6 km² of this protected nature area are completely open to you, so long as you follow the site's strict rules for protecting the health and safety of its plantlife and wildlife.

Fans of nature, the plant and animal kingdoms, and photography in all its forms, you've definitely come to the right place!

Take a walk along a kilometre-long loop to discover a strip of dunes, its particular vegetation, a series of extraordinary bodies of water, and uniquely diverse atmospheres.

Devices destined to raise awareness among sailors and tourists have been inaugurated. More than fifty 'Biohut' (artificial nurseries) have also been installed in order to transform the port into a safe habitat zone for the fishes.

Not to mention the modern services and equipments offered to preserve the quality of the water in the harbour.

Thanks to all these measures, Port Fréjus is now saluted as an innovative an ecofriendly harbour. And there is more to come soon !

Fréjus's fishing boats, to immerse you in the traditions of Provençal fisherfolk.

These pointus – small boats that are typical of the ports of Provence – can be found along the coast of the French Riviera. Although mainly used as fishing boats, they can also serve as passenger boats or pleasure boats, whilst maintaining a certain romantic, nostalgic je ne sais quoi.

Don't hesitate to admire them, take pictures of them and chat with their owners, who always have plenty of anecdotes and one-of-a-kind knowledge to share.

Important: A pointu isn't a pleasure boat that you can hire, as witnessed by the Provençal proverb, "Si me coneïsse pas, me toques pas!" ("If you don't know me, don't touch me! "). These hard-to-manoeuvre boats are original watercraft that remain true to the fishing skippers or amateur sailors who own them...

I also love spending time in nature, birdwatching at the Villepey ponds, where you feel both close to and far from the city.


After that, I cross the road and I go to read a book on the Saint-Aygulf beach listening the sound of the waves.

And don't forget the Arts and Crafts Circuit in the town centre, which you can explore according to your tastes and preferences!

When craftspeople moved into the historic centre of Fréjus, they revived a tradition that originated in potters' studios located inside the ancient town, before it died out in the 18th century.

As a member of Ville et Métiers d'Art, a network of municipalities that actively support their crafts industries, Fréjus encourages the set-up of these year-round art studios and invites you on this tour to discover traditional methods that are constantly being updated. Painters, framers, ceramicists, potters and gilders are waiting for your visit!

The Arts and Crafts Circuit includes 37 artists and craftspeople, 16 of whom occupy a local. Among the various trades on offer are: bronze founders, potters, decorative upholsterers, lithographers, bookbinders, glassmakers, painters, photographers, sculptors, graphic artists, plastic artists, picture restorers, decoration designers, clothing and jewelry designers...

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

Since their creation by Cardinal Richelieu 401 years ago, the Marine Troops made history in the four corners of the world. Whether they were colonial footsoldiers (called "Marsouins") or gunners ("Bigors") or indigenous troops, their unit operated under the golden anchor of the Marines.

They distinguished themselves with success after success in France's overseas territories.

In Europe, they were on the front lines of the Crimean War and the Franco-Prussian War in which, during the battle of the "last cartridges" in Bazeilles, some men under Commander Lambert fought down to their last ounce of strength in a testament to the valour and honour of those elite soldiers.

This legendary heroic feat has become synonymous with a grand celebration for the Marine Troops who honour their fallen heroes each year on 31 August, in Fréjus's Roman arena

The MARINE TROOPS MUSEUM has a new look !

This museum was built on the recollections, the heroic actions and the blood of the Marine Troops. It pays tribute to a branch of the French Army that has been so invaluable to the nation and to Fréjus.

The only one of its kind on the French Riviera, it contains uniforms, weapons, furniture, reconstructions, documents, archives and many other collections relating to those who wrote France's history in letters of blood and gold!





Designed and introduced by Ecocean, and modelled after its Biohuts, this trail features multiple fun modules shaped like crabs, jellyfish, sea snakes and more, and also has the benefit of providing habitats for underwater species of plants and animals that take refuge in these sunken houses that were installed a few years back by the docks at the port.

If you don't want to make anyone jealous or if you want to enjoy a little freshwater, there is no shortage of private and municipal swimming pools in our region.

If you want to go exploring, you can absolutely go **kayaking** or **boating** on one of our rivers! You'll be able to **paddle** up the Argens whilst making the most of its riverbanks.




Saturday is devoted to the preparation of a giant omelette for the children as well as a giant onion soup.

And to be savoured in friendship, with generosity and a willingness to share.



The BRAVADE

Fréjus, saved and grateful: The story behind the Bravade

The roots of the Bravade that is so beloved today are spiritual, first and foremost, since it is a tribute from the women and men of Fréjus to their saviour and patron saint, Saint Francis of Paola.

Over the course of four days, tourists and locals of all ages gather for processions, parades, dances, Masses and original performances in honour of Saint Francis of Paola who, in 1482, saved Fréjus from the bubonic plague, which was ravaging all of Europe.

Saint Francis of Paola, the apostle of charity

Fréjus is intimately linked to its patron saint, Saint Francis of Paola.

He became a hermit when he was 12 and founded the Order of Minims at the age of 19, whose motto, "Charitas" ("Charity") became legendary and inspired a spiritual reawakening in the late 15th century. During his lifetime, the young Francis of Paola (a town in Calabria, Italy) already came across as a saint. Praying, fasting and helping the poorest and sickest people at any hour of day or night, his contemporaries, be the humble, monks, kings or soldiers, painted a magnificent portrait of him as a pious, gentle and loving man.

Although he is buried in Plessis-lèz-Tours, you can still see and pray over the relics of this saint who is so dear to the people of Fréjus in Saint-Léonce Cathedral and in the chapel that bears his name at the gateway to the historic centre.


